USW Chaplains Bargaining Bulletin #1 - Bargaining Survey

Hello Chaplains,

As you may know, our first collective bargaining agreement (CBA) with our employer, Bridges of Canada, will expire on March 31, 2022. This means that we will begin negotiations soon for a renewal collective agreement. This is the first of many updates about that process and about related issues that arise during the bargaining process.

It is very important that we have your input as we enter into negotiations for a renewal collective bargaining agreement. Please complete the survey and tell us about your priorities and workplace concerns so that we may try to address them at the bargaining table with the Company.

## 3) COVID-19 and Reductions in Work for Chaplains

Although we understand the importance of safety of inmates and workers during this difficult time, we were disappointed to see that Bridges and the CSC chose to force a layoff of chaplains to address the rising cases of COVID in our workplaces. CSC made the decision to cut hours, rather than allow chaplains to continue working on an on-call basis remotely as the federal government has done with other public servants. This layoff, again, indicates the importance of better job security language in our collective agreement and will be a priority at the bargaining table.

The Company was supposed to have issued Records of Employment within five (5) days of the interruption of work. If you still have not received your Record of Employment or are experiencing complications in applying for employment insurance, please contact us immediately so that we may help you to resolve it.

Please also advise us if you experience shift cancellations or scheduling reductions on short notice so that we may examine if such reductions are in violation of the Canada Labour Code or the collective agreement.
